Partnership News

Dear Colleagues,

Welcome to the 14th edition of our termly newsletter.

I hope the new academic year has started well in your school. I have to admit that I've found the first three weeks of my headship quite busy but so far so good. I know that Chris Healy was immensely proud of the work that partnership did together and I am very keen that it should continue to develop and evolve. There is so much to be gained from working with one another and collaborating freely in a common cause.

Last year saw yet another packed program with some of the stand out events being the development of the Literacy network, the introduction of a middle leader's forum and the continued success of the Pastoral Care conference. There was continued superb attendance of the subject forums with the geography and MfL conferences in the summer term being particularly well attended. It is also important to highlight yet again the success of the NQT network, last year 15 NQT's enjoyed the program on offer and really benefitted from cross school and phase support from NQTs across the partnership. The Maths Hub is another real highlight and I would like to once again pay tribute to the work of Steve Lomax and his team.

All of the regular events will be in the 2016-17 program but this year we have some exciting plans to launch a KS2/3 Transition group. Quite how this will develop will be determined by those in attendance but, without question, the challenges that our primary colleagues have faced over the past two years with changes to assessment and the curriculum will be a major focus for discussion. I am convinced that if we are to meet the challenges of a changing KS4 curriculum we must look to improve transition and progress at KS3. Working with primary schools is clearly the place to start.

The planning for the fifth Annual conference on the 25th November is almost complete and we will be issuing detailed information on all the workshops very soon. We are delighted that David Didau and Professor Robert Coe will be the keynote speakers on the theme of 'How do we know learning is happening?' We have been overwhelmed by the offers of support from colleagues across the partnership and I am sure when you see the full program you will be keen to send as many staff as possible

Finally I think we should be open to discussions amongst our schools over the future of education more generally. The development of MATs, the proposal to increase selection and the challenges surrounding school funding are all areas that we will be discussing separately. I don't see any harm in us discussing them together and perhaps, where appropriate, coordinating a joint response.

Session 1: Setting the agenda

Colleagues from the Primary and Secondary phase are invited to this launch meeting of our new KS2/3 Transition group.

The changes to the KS2 Curriculum and assessment has been monumental and so we hope that this group can act to ensure a smooth transition for all pupils and teachers.

Areas that we might focus on are...

- How to inform and up-skill teachers in the secondary sector of the changes to assessment and SPaG and Numeracy requirements
- How to deal with the perceived 'dip' into Year 7.
- Pastoral issues
- Transition issues
- Cross Checking of the curriculum delivery in other areas of the curriculum
- Catering for pupils with SEND.

The agenda is very open to input from the group themselves and we hope that it will lead to the opportunity for cross visits into schools in both phases.

It is hoped that you will leave feeling suitably confident and creative to design and deliver a cross-curricular workshop or series of lessons and ensure effective learning for pupils in your school.

South America (going beyond Brazil; based on the texts, 'Mia's Story' by Michael Foreman and 'Blue Frog' by Holly Stone-Barker and Dianne de Las Casas and incorporating activities relating to Chile, the Mayans and Aztecs, the legend of chocolate, exploring native foods and making ceviche and salsa. You will rotate around three 'stations', honing your skills in different curriculum areas in the process).
