UCAS 2024-25

The UCAS deadline has now passed and we have submitted 176 applications, which includes some from alumni who we are always keen to support. Many of these students have already participated in university interviews or admission tests and many have already received offers. We are delighted to mention that 3 of our students have received offers from Oxbridge universities.

Debates

Our annual inter-tutor group debate competition is both a long running and a hotly contested affair. Each tutor group puts up a team and the students battle it out together. Recent topics have included 'Ignorance is bliss' and 'All students should study Maths and English up to the age of 18 at the expense of other subjects'. It's a real highlight of the year and our students acquit themselves superbly. The finale is a big celebration event when we use the main hall and invite a guest adjudicator to proclaim the final judgement. This is also a great way of making sure that Year 12 and Year 13 get the opportunity to bond and share their Sixth Form experience.

Notice For Parents Of Year 11 & Year 13 Heather Harris, Examinations Officer

We have received the following message from the national examination boards. Please read it carefully. If you child is taking examinations this summer, please make sure to keep the dates below available should it be necessary for the examination boards to schedule examination for those dates.

From National Examination Boards Summer 2024 contingency days

The awarding bodies have collectively agreed a contingency day for several years now which is always scheduled at the end of the GCSE, GCE AS and A-level exam timetables.

The contingency day is in the event of national or significant local disruption to exams in the United Kingdom, being part of the awarding bodies' standard contingency planning for exams.

Following the Covid-19 pandemic, further resilience was needed within the exam timetables. A single contingency day was not felt to be sufficient if a national event or incident had a significant effect on the exam timetable. For example, summer exams could be affected by extremely high temperatures.

The awarding bodies have designated two additional half-day contingency sessions for summer 2024 examinations: These are on:

Thursday 6th June PM and Thursday 13th June PM

The standard contingency day remains at the end of the timetable being scheduled on:

26th June 2024

Schools and colleges should ensure candidates and parents are aware of the contingency arrangements on these three days. They should consider the contingency day of 26th June when making their plans for the summer. Candidates should be encouraged to remain available until 26th June should examinations need to be rescheduled.
