Dear Parents,

Welcome back to another school year. I hope that you and your family had a pleasant summer holiday. Mine was great—we spent a week in Wales, where it rained a lot, and a week in Guernsey, where the sun shone every day. The new term has started well and there is a purposeful and busy atmosphere around the school.

Exam Results

The results our students achieved in the summer were quite simply the best in the school's history. 92% of students achieved 5A*/C including English and maths, which is a new school record. The results in English and maths, which were both reformed GCSEs, were amazing. 19 students achieved a grade 9 in maths and 19 students achieved a grade 9 in either English Language or English literature. 83% of students achieved a grade 5-9 in maths and 85% of students did so in English. When the national results are published I believe that these results will place the school amongst the highest achieving nationally.

At A level the picture was similarly pleasing. 67% of grades at A level were awarded at grade A* to B which is a new record for the school. Our AS results were also the highest we've ever achieved with 52% of grades being awarded at A to B. The vast majority of our students were able to access their first choice university and the current Year 13 have a wonderful platform upon which to build.

I'd like to congratulate all of our students and pay tribute to the hard work of their teachers.

Value Added

Later this term the government will publish the value added figures for both GCSE and A level. I believe that our figures will be very positive. We subscribe to a results service called ALPS which is a way of comparing your results instantly to the national data set.

An ALPS grade 2 means that the school is operating in the top 10% of schools nationally. To be doing so at each examination point is exceptional. It's a difficult job to get outstanding value added at A level when you've already done it at GCSE. The fact that our students are able to do so is a great testament to their hard work and dedication, the wonderful support of you, their parents, and the skill and drive of the teachers.

Building work

It's been a busy summer of works here at Balcarras. We have a brand new science lab, the pavilion has been converted into the Year 11 Common Room, the fire alarm system has been completely

overhauled and there has been a full programme of re-decoration around the school. Despite the difficult funding situation we find ourselves in, we are determined to invest in the school as much as we can.

You will have noticed that the new music block is not yet ready. We are hoping that it will be completed shortly after half term. There are also two new covered areas being built in the school which will be ready at about the same time.

Gift Aid - The Big Squeeze



Lost property

Every week we have HUGE quantities of lost property handed into Reception, usually unnamed. We ask parents to PLEASE label items of clothing, footwear, school bags, PE kits and PE drawstring bags with NAMES (<u>not just initials</u>.) Lost items that are labelled will be returned to their owners, as far as possible.

Once a month lost items that are not labelled will be displayed for the day when pupils and parents are welcome to view and collect any lost property belonging to them or their child. The dates when lost property will be displayed are shown in the school calendar – usually the last Monday of each month.

Unfortunately, any items that are not collected will have to be disposed of. We hope this will reduce our ever increasing mountain of lost property. Thank you for your cooperation.

Pupils with Medical Conditions

Parents/Guardians need to inform the school if their child has a medical condition or an allergy. If necessary, the school will implement a 'Care Plan'.

Paracetamol Permission

It is a legal requirement that the school has written parental permission before paracetamol is given for pain relief (i.e. for an occasional headache, toothache, menstrual pain etc.) Once a permission slip has been signed and returned to the school, the permission will be effective until the pupil leaves the school, unless the school is informed of any changes.

The school will **record the date and time in the pupil's planner**, when the paracetamol is given, so that parents are aware. This is an important safety measure. Pupils **without** a planner will **not** be given paracetamol.

If paracetamol permission was given on the data collection sheet last year, this will be effective until the pupil leaves the school, unless the school is informed of any changes. If a data collection sheet has not been signed previously (especially Year 7 parents) and you would like to give permission, please update your data collection sheet that you will be receiving shortly, signed and return to the school.
