This unit follows a visit to the Pitt Rivers/Natural History museums in Oxford. It aims to continue to build on pupils' knowledge and experience of the art and craft of other cultures. Pupils will design and build their own ceramic vessel using their own research and designs.

- Pupils will be introduced to modelling, hand building and decorative ceramic techniques.
- They will be shown how to use the museum visit as well as independent research to create appropriate design ideas.
- Pupils will research and explore the work of different makers from different times and places.
- Pupils will combine their knowledge and skills to produce a 3D ceramic outcome of their own design.
