Content (Intent)				
Prior Learning (Year 6) • Plan for audience and purpose. • Develop character and setting in a narrative • Use cohesive devices • Grammatical consistency • Begin to select vocab for effect. This unit begins with the question: 'What is a ghost story?' and a discussion of genre and convention. The unit then focuses on developing the skills that the students need in order to write their own ghost story. Lessons will focus on using senses and ambitious literary devices; structuring a story using the story mountain model; using sentence structure and punctuation for effect and paragraphing for effect. Students will also be taught how to analyse a literary text and how to use literary terms within their analysis. Students will also have lessons on how to edit their ghost stories before their final written assessment. The unit ends with the development of speaking and listening skills through modelling, rehearsal and a final atmospheric performance of their ghost story.
