Content (Intent)				
 Prior Learning (Year 6) Write in different styles- to include the Haiku. Please note – most year 7 students will not have experience in analysing poetry so this unit acts as an introduction. 				
This unit begins with an introduction to the theme of identity and culture. We will explore the key question: what is identity? The following lessons will include:				
\checkmark An introduction to key poetic techniques and terminology.				
\checkmark Lessons on how to annotate and approach poetry – identifying techniques within poems.				
 Lessons introducing the idea of PETAL paragraphs – applying annotation skills to written answers. 				
\checkmark Lesson applying understanding of poetry to their own creative poetry writing.
