Content (Intent)

Prior Learning (Topic)

Prior learning links to Year 7 Introduction to Shakespeare (Tempest) as well as building on dramatic conventions, such as tragedy from Blood Brothers last term.

This unit begins with the key question: What is a Shakespearean Tragedy?

- ✓ Lesson on the Prologue, building and linking in Shakespearean tragedy. Starting to get students familiar again with analysing and understanding Shakespearean language.
- ✓ Lessons exploring context: general overview and then more specific focus on young men and women in Shakespeare's Time.
- ✓ Lesson to focus on Mercutio building in skills of analysing a key character.
- ✓ Lesson covering essay structure (analytical paragraphs, building argument, introductions and conclusions)
