<p>Pupils will learn about economic activity in the primary, secondary, tertiary and quaternary sectors; and the use of natural resources. They will also understand how human and physical processes interact to influence, and change landscapes. Also, how human activity relies on effective functioning of natural systems. They will also learn about different levels of development and inequality. The problems of unfair trade such as sweatshops, and then solutions to make trade fairer.</p>

<p>Firstly, pupils will be taught what trade is and the different categories that is can be put into (Primary, secondary, tertiary and Quaternary industries, Informal and formal jobs).</p> <p>Then they will look at what globalisation is and how it has affected different countries and businesses.</p> <p>There is then a look at whether trade is fair, and the impacts of sweatshops on workers.
