RO33 (Supporting individuals through life events)

Content (Intent)

Prior Learning (Topic)

Unit RO33 is an NEA unit delivered and assessed in Year 10. The content of the unit will partly be covered by some introductory lessons that begin the Y10 course and aim to facilitate the development of essential skills and knowledge for the H&SC course. There is also significant cross over with work covered in the exam unit RO32 which will also be partly covered in Year 10 and finished in Year 11. These two units will be taught flexibly in tandem throughout Year 10, with areas of overlapped highlighted in lessons. These will include (but not limited to) the following topic areas:

- Rights of service users in H&SC settings
- Person centred values
- Effective communication in H&SC settings

Future Learning (Topic)

There will also be links to topics covered in Year 11 on the NEA unit RO35 (Health promotion campaign.) Students will need to use skills they developed in RO33, such as pertinent events in life events and the impact of these, when planning and delivering a health promotion campaign. They will also be able to use and develop further their practical skills and ability to evaluate their work.

Unit RO33 will also have curriculum links to the KS5 course should students continue their studies of health and social care. Learning is relevant to the following units taught in Year 12 and 13:

Unit 1 Building positive relationships in health and social care,

Unit 2 Equality, diversity and rights in health and social care,

Unit 10 Nutrition for health

Unit 17 Supporting people with mental health conditions.
