<p>This is the first coursework unit delivered in Year 12, taught alongside the exam unit (Unit 3). There is some crossover with topics covered within Unit 2 (Equality, diversity and rights in health and social care) which is also taught in Year 12, particularly in LO2 (Understand factors that influence the building of relationships).</p> <p>For those who have studied H&SC in KS4 there will be considerable amounts of relevant prior learning.
