Content (Intent)

Prior Learning (Topic) KS3 – Year 8 Making of Modern Britain, Year 9 20th Century & citizenship and PSHE lessons throughout the school KS5 - In the previous component, students will have encountered some of the key concepts in Component 2, such as constitutional law, rights and Parliamentary sovereignty.
