Component 2 - PM & Executive/Relations between branches

Prior Learning (Topic) KS3 – Year 8 Making of Modern Britain, Year 9 20th Century & citizenship and PSHE lessons throughout the school KS5 - In the previous component, students will have encountered some of the key concepts in Component 2, such as constitutional law, rights and Parliamentary sovereignty. In this component, they will now have a fundamental appreciation of the UK's Constitution and Parliament.

- The aims, role and impact of the European Union (EU) on UK government.
- The location of sovereignty in the UK political system.
