How can parents help at home?		
<p>One of the most helpful ways that parents can help is through helping pupils to learn vocabulary and encouraging independent study. It doesn't matter if you don't know any French yourself.</p> <p>Encourage your child to be 'active' in the learning and not 'passive' i.e. they should write the words down or say them out loud several times, or even record themselves. Parents can then test them.</p>
