Content (Intent)		
Prior Learning (Topic): - Russian alphabet (part 1 to part 5) and basic greetings.		
Students will learn: - The Russian alphabet (part 6 and part 7) - The printed and the cursive forms of the letters - Vocabulary to accompany alphabet parts 6 and 7 - The numbers 1-20 - How to say how old they are		
Future Learning (Topic): - Knowing the full alphabet will be the basis of the rest of the Russian course.		
How will knowledge and skills be taught? (Implementation)	How will your understanding be assessed & recorded (Impact)	
Listening and reading activities. Classwork on phonics. Repetition and speaking activities.	Pupils will be tested on each part of the alphabet and should be expected to know all the letters from part 1-7. There will be a whole alphabet test at the end of the term. Pupils will be expected to recognise and spell a selection of the words they have learned to accompany their alphabet learning.	
How can parents help at home?
