Topic		
Clothes, talking about sporting events and writing about a problem		
Content (Intent)		
<b>Prior Learning (Topic): Hometown, arranging to go out, making excuses and discussing getting ready to go out</b>		
Students will learn about: How to describe clothes and the clothes that they wear. Students will talk about sporting events using three tenses and practise translation skills. Students will learn how to describe a problem and how to answer at GCSE photo cards and prepare a speaking roleplay. <b>Grammar:</b> Using structures with two verbs, present tense, preterite tense, near future tense, using negatives (never, not, nothing), adjectival agreements, reflexive verbs, me gustaría + infinitive, modal verbs (poder + querer) and demonstrative adjectives.

How can parents help at home?		
One of the most helpful ways that parents can help is through helping pupils to learn vocabulary. It doesn't matter if you don't know any Spanish yourself. Encourage your child to be 'active' in the learning and not 'passive' i.e. they should write the words down or speak them out several times, or even record themselves. Parents can then test them by saying the English and the child either has to spell it out or write it down. YouTube and Quizlet is also a great resource for hearing and practising vocabulary.
