YEAR 10 Mock Examinations week Commencing 8th April 2024

Balcarras is responsible for implementing and facilitating a very precise set of requirements in all public Exams and are governed by JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) in this process. The Exams Officer, Assistant Exams Officer and a team of invigilators will enforce these rules and regulations for the Year 11 mock exams providing a realistic view of examinations in preparation for the summer.

The following should outline everything you need to know.

Study Leave

Study Leave for Year 11 students will commence on Monday 8th April. Students will return to normal lessons on Monday 15th April.

Examination Timetables

All students will be given a copy of their individual examination timetable. The generic timetable can be found on the website <u>www.balcarras.gloucs.sch.uk/exams</u> Replacement copies can be obtained from The Exams office located in the sixth form block.

Punctuality is very important. The Mock Exams are scheduled to commence at:

Monday/Tuesday: 9am, 11.30am and 2pm Wednesday/Thursday/Friday: 9am, <u>2.30pm</u>

Students **must** arrive **20 minutes before** the scheduled start time – this is to ensure all students can be seated, in a calm and orderly fashion, notices read, and examinations are started promptly.

Where students have extra time or in the event of examinations not starting on time, for students concerned that they will not make their next exam, please be rest assured we will not expect any student to go from one exam to the other without a sufficient break in between.

Rooming

We are unable to allocate the same room and the same seat for all examinations. The student's individual copy of the examination timetable will detail which room they will be taking their exam, no seating plans will be published on the notice board except for last minutes unavoidable room changes.

What to wear?

The uniform rules for examinations are the same as for normal school lessons. Full school uniform must be worn, smart school shoes, correct skirts and trousers, no hoodies or non-school jumpers are permissible. Makeup and jewellery are not permitted.

What to bring?

It is the student's responsibility to ensure they have the correct equipment/tools they will require during the exam.

- **Black pens** only to write with (no gel pens)
- Pencil, eraser, ruler etc
- Maths equipment
- Calculator (must be cleared of memory in advance. Calculator lids/cases are not permitted)
- Students may bring these items in a clear pencil case/bag.

Please note that hi-lighter pens maybe used on the question paper but NOT on the students answers. Correction fluid/tape are also not allowed.

Students may bring a drink, but it must be <u>clear</u> liquid in a <u>clear bottle</u> - the invigilators must be able to "see through" it. No labels or writing on the bottles.

Students must not write anything until invited to do so. Any student doing extra time will be asked to write with a different coloured pen (provided) to indicate their work done during the extra time.

Students, wherever possible must avoid bringing any personal possessions. Please bring to school only what is required to sit the exam. If this is unavoidable, items must be stored in lockers or tidily under the stairs in the foyer between Maths and Science. **NB**: The school cannot be held responsible for the safety of student's possessions.

Prohibited Items

<u>Airpods</u> <u>Earphones/earbuds</u> <u>Ipods</u> <u>Mobile Phones or similar devices</u> <u>Watches</u>

These items are <u>strictly prohibited</u> from the examination room. If at all possible, it is advisable to <u>leave these items at home</u> – THEY WIL NOT BE PERMITTED INTO THE EXAMINATION ROOM. If bringing them in is unavoidable students will be asked to hand them into an invigilator whereupon they may be collected outside of the exam's office after the exam.

NB: The exams office cannot accept responsibility for these items.

Conduct

The high levels of conduct expected at Balcarras extends to behaviour during the examination period. Appropriate conduct during the exams is of upmost importance for the good of all students, any student found talking, napping, creating a disturbance or exhibiting

unruly behaviour will be asked to leave the examination room and be reported to senior management.

Students will be under exam conditions from the moment they enter the exam room until the moment they leave. Students are asked to respect the exam barriers and to move quickly and quietly away when they leave the exam room – others may still be working!

The Exams team are here to ensure the examination experience is as true to the public Exams as is possible and we are here to assist in whatever way we can.

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
