Mandatory units: for all students

Infection Control (internally assessed)

- Understand infection control in health and social care
- Know the chain of infection
- Be able to control the spread of infection
- Understand the role of the health and social care worker in controlling infection

Safeguarding (externally assessed)

- Understand types and signs of abuse
- Understand factors which may lead to abusive situations
- Understand legislation, regulatory requirements and guidance which govern the safeguarding of adults, young people and children
- Understand how to deal with suspected abuse and disclosures of abuse
- Understand working strategies and procedures for the safeguarding and protection of adults, young people and children
- Understand how workers within health, social care and child care environments can minimise the risk of abuse

OCR Level 3

Cambridge Technical (Tech Level) Diploma in Health Science

A revolutionary and **nationally recognised qualification** which is the equivalent to an A-Level however, it benefits from internal assessment. Therefore this elevates some of the stress and pressure of exams.

Universities have recognised this qualification as an A-level equivalent and they are awarding it the same UCAS points as an A-level, therefore a Distinction* in the OCR Level 3 Certificate is worth the same as an A-level grade A* and therefore it is worth 140 UCAS points.

Cambridge Technicals have been developed with a number of universities, leading employers and industry specialists who have a reputation for offering *creative and inspiring vocational qualifications*. They have a clear, practical and sensible approach to assessment and will enable students to *develop transferable skills* that are essential in the workplace or for further study.

Cambridge Technicals are 55% internally assessed. The external assessments (exams) can be taken in January and June and students are able to resit them.

There is a *natural progression through the grading* criteria from Pass through to Merit and Distinction, reflecting current sector practice.
