Why Are We Here?

- ▶ Your Children **WILL** come into contact with drugs.
- ▶ Some....but not all will use and experiment with these drugs.
- ▶ We've already given educational drugs advice to students and the aim is to make **YOU** better prepared, to know what to look out for with your children. Together we have a duty to safeguard young adults.

Types Of Drugs We Will Be Focusing On

- ▶ Cannabis
- ▶ Ketamine
- ▶ MDMA/Ecstasy
- ▶ Cocaine
- ▶ Spice
- ▶ MCAT
- ▶ Nitrous Oxide

These are all drugs that we as a Constabulary are regularly finding teenagers in possession of.

What Do They Look Like ?



Cannabis

Green Dried leaves and plant material.

Smoked with or without Tobacco, usually hand rolled into a 'joint'

Causes euphoria, relaxation, hallucinations hilarity and increased appetite.

Look out for glazed eyes with large pupils, distinctive herbal smell, torn cigarette papers and packets.

What Do They Look Like ?



Ecstasy/MDMA

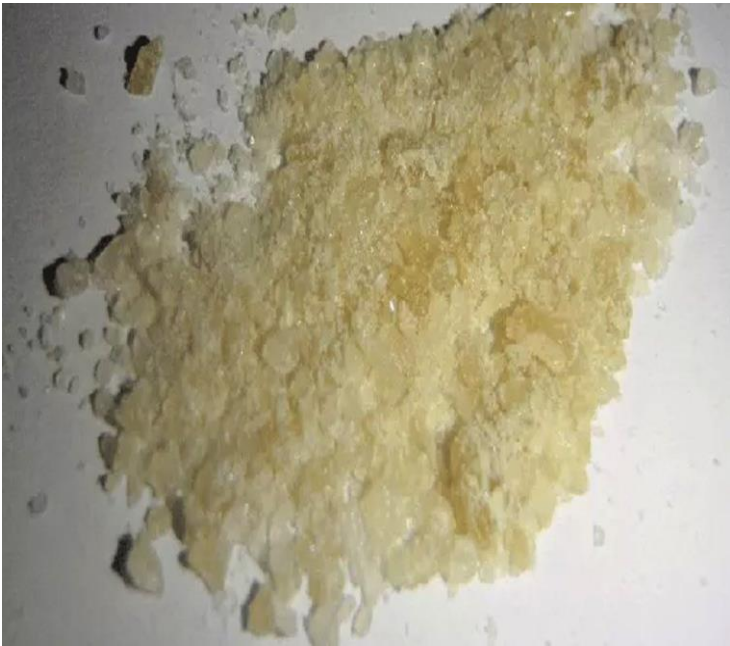
Various coloured and shaped tablets with or without motifs.

Taken orally

Causes increased energy, heightened perception of colour and sound. Some hallucinations

Look out for lack of co-ordination, anxious or confused state. Paranoia and insomnia.

What Do They Look Like ?



Crystal MDMA.

Off white crystal substance

Taken orally or snorted.

Causes increased energy, heightened perception of colour and sound. Some hallucinations. Quicker than tablet form.

Look out for lack of co-ordination, anxious or confused state. Paranoia and insomnia.

What Do They Look Like ?



Ketamine

Clear liquid, White powder or tablets.

Usually snorted, but can be used with cannabis or tobacco. Can be injected.

Causes hallucinations, visual distortions, loss of sense of time and identity. Incapacity lasts between 1.5 and 3 hours.

Look out for white powder or tablets.

What Do They Look Like ?



Mephedrone

Formerly a 'legal high'. Sold as plant food. White or off white powder or capsules.

Snorted or taken orally.

Similar to ecstasy. 1 – 5 minutes after taking the drug, users report a sudden rush causing euphoria. Extreme alertness, increased serotonin in the brain.

Look out for extreme hyperactivity, talkativeness and sweating.

What Do They Look Like ?



Cocaine

White slightly crystalline powder.

Snorted or in extreme cases injected.

Increased alertness and pulse rate, increased blood pressure, false sense of high energy and euphoria.

Look out for Nervousness, irritability, loss of appetite and weight, prolonged periods of sleep.

What Do They Look Like ?



SPICE/Synthetic Cannaboids

Similar in appearance to herbal cannabis

Hand rolled and smoked in a 'joint'. Smoked in pipes or bongs. Can be taken orally in food.

Synthetic cannabis imitates the psychological effects of regular cannabis, These include but not limited to, euphoria, relaxation, hilarity and increased appetite.

Look out for lack of co-ordination, glazed eyes, large pupils, distinctive herbal smell. Zombie like state

What Do They Look Like ?



Nitrous Oxide/NOS

Found in small gas canisters

Usually emptied into a balloon, before being inhaled in one deep breath.

Feelings of euphoria, and relaxation. Hallucinations. Slows down your brain and body functions.

Look out for dizziness, difficulty in thinking straight.

Instant death can be caused by lack of Oxygen.

What Do I Need To Look Out For ?

- ▶ Asking for more money/Cash goes missing
- ▶ Change in behaviour
- ▶ New friends, new social groups.
- ▶ Physically attached to phone
- ▶ Pale face, enlarged pupils.
- ▶ You know them better than anyone.. Somethings just not right!
- ▶ Smell on clothes
- ▶ Lack of concentration/Change in school grades
- ▶ Small resealable bags
- ▶ Increased sickness/nosebleeds

Mobile Phones.

- ▶ These days an important part of everyday life.
- ▶ Drug dealing or purchasing does not happen without mobile phones.
- ▶ Majority of evidence in drug related offences come from phones.
- ▶ Check their mobile phones and usage.
- ▶ Majority of you pay for the phones. Limit access and capability.
- ▶ Be aware of WhatsApp, Snap Chat, Messenger, Facebook.. etc.
- ▶ Police will not criticise you for looking through your Child's phone.

B	Cannabis. Amphetamine. SPICE. Ketamine.	Up to 5 years in prison/ unlimited fine	Up to 14 in prison/unlimited fine
C	Steroids. Ketamine. Diazepam.	Up to 2 years in prison/ unlimited fine	Up to 14 in prison/unlimited fine

What Happens When Your Child Is Arrested For Drugs Offences..?

- They will be handcuffed and placed in a Police vehicle constantly supervised.
- Your home will be searched
- You will be expected to attend custody to act as appropriate adult.
- They will be strip searched in front of two officers
- They will be placed into a Police cell on their own.
- They will appear in front of a court

The Future For Your Child ?

Certain Universities will not accept applications from those with Drugs Convictions.

You will not be able to do the following jobs with a drugs conviction.

- Police Officer
- Fire Service
- NHS – Ambulance/Doctor/Nurse
- Civil Servant
- Teacher
- Retail (Certain Areas)
- Child Care
- Armed Services will not accept anyone convicted of drug dealing.

The following countries will not allow you to obtain a travel visa with a drugs conviction.
