Welcome from the Headteacher

Dear Parents.

Hope all is well with you as we head towards Christmas. I have to say I'm looking forward to it already....I just love the mince pie season!

I am delighted by how the school year is progressing. I spend quite a lot of time walking around the school and sampling the atmosphere and I have to say it is real pleasure to observe just how positive and engaged our young people are. On this theme, earlier in the term, I hosted a visit from the Gloucestershire Education Forum whose Chair is Roy Blatchford. Several colleagues from Gloucestershire attended a seminar and went on a learning walk around the school. The theme for the visit was our work with SEND children but in fact we had a good look at what was going on across the school. After the visit Roy wrote the staff a letter. Here is an excerpt: "Might I say—as someone who visits lots of classrooms in the UK and internationally—that the Balcarras culture for learning is amongst the best I see anywhere: sparkling environments, focused students, animated and intelligent teaching. That cocktail which you have established over time is special—and a privilege to visit."

I must say I was delighted to read this. As ever huge credit must go to the pupils who just continue to be a delight to work with and for.

BALCARRAS AMONGST TOP 30 COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTRY DOMINIC BURKE, HEADTEACHER

We are at that point of the year where we can compare last year's examinations results to other schools up and down the country. As ever Balcarras compares very favourably. One of the government's key measures is the percentage of pupils gaining 5+ in English and Maths. Balcarras achieved 78% and in doing so secured a position inside the top 30 comprehensive schools in the country. Once again well done to last year's Year 11.

UCAS ENTRY DOMINIC BURKE, HEADTEACHER

It is an exciting time of year in the sixth form because students in Year 13 are busy putting in applications for UCAS or for apprenticeships. I would like to thank the sixth form team for their sterling work in supporting what is a big year group. The Early Entry candidates (entry for Oxford, Cambridge, Veterinary and Medicine) are starting to hear whether they have got an interview. So far 13 pupils have secured an interview at either Oxford (8) or Cambridge (5) and we have still yet to hear about a further 4. Well done to them.

WINCHCOMBE SCHOOL JOINS THE BALCARRAS TRUST DOMINIC BURKE, HEADTEACHER

On November 1st Winchcombe School joined the Balcarras Trust. There is a long history of collaboration between the two schools and I am delighted that this collaboration is now formalised. I am a firm believer that schools have much to learn from each other.

On Friday 24th November 200 colleagues from across the Trust's schools met at the Balcarras campus for the annual conference. This year's theme was wellbeing specifically related to staff. Our keynote speaker was Belinda Heaven from GHLL and her talk went down very well. After the keynote there were a number of workshops for staff to choose from. The topic we chose for this year's conference demonstrates our commitment to ensuring that everyone who works here feels well supported.

It has been quite a term for Girls Hockey. The Under 16 Girls won the County Championship and came ever so close to reaching the National finals. Last Friday the Under 12 Team won the County Championships beating Kings School 1-0 in the final. They now go forward to the regionals.

In Cross Country Balcarras once again dominated the District Competition winning 5 of the 8 age range competitions. Well done to everyone who took part.

In tennis the Year 7 and 8 boys team came third in the Southwest Regional Finals held at Bath University. Well done to them.

I am delighted to see so many trips and visits going out since the start of the year. I had a great time with the geography department in Iceland during half term and I know that all sorts of things have been going on since. Again, the website is a good place to go if you want a flavour of this.

Cut Your Carbon Month Jon Pearce, Ecoclub

Throughout November Balcarras have been taking part in cut your carbon month. This idea came from Ecoschools, who award the Green flag. Balcarras have been awarded this a couple of times in the last few years. The Eco club came up with suggestions on how to reduce the schools and individuals carbon footprint. Pupils have been given a 9 part challenge to cut their carbon, with ideas such as having a 'meat free day' or 'ditching the drive'. Pupils who take part will be entered into a draw for some fairtrade chocolate as way of a well done for taking positive actions.

We had a guest speaker come into school and talk with the Eco club and sixth formers, she was the 'Cheltenham Borough Council, clean air education officer' and she had lots of information on the poor state of air quality in our town and how to reduce the impacts of this on our health. For example, did you know you are exposed to worse air quality if you sit in a car in traffic, than if you are walking past traffic. Also, an idling car releases 150 balloons worth of pollution per minute.

The staff had an 'empty car park day' where they were encouraged to car share, walk or cycle. There was a 25% reduction in the number of cars in the car park on that day, ten staff won a prize of fairtrade chocolate to celebrate this.

Our early deadline exists to enable us to triple-check applications, personal statements and academic references ahead of their final submission to UCAS. Even if your son or daughter is currently considering a gap year or a deferral, we strongly recommend that applications are made in order to ensure students have all post-18 options open to them next autumn.

Breaking The Chain — Year 7 Pupils Neil Baxter, Deputy Headteacher

Year 7 will watch "Breaking the Chain" on 1st February 2024

Balcarras School believes that the Personal Development programme is integral to the education offered to all pupils at Balcarras. As part of the programme, in 2024, for the first time, Year 7 will participate in a workshop called "Breaking the Chain" run by Narrative Alchemy Theatre Company. Below is a description from their website:

"Breaking the Chain is an applied theatre production that aims to raise awareness, kick-start conversations and build resilience around youth violence – with a focus on knife crime – as part of a public health approach to tackling the issue – an issue that is seeing young people seriously hurt and, all too often, killed on the streets of our towns and cities.

Recently out of prison and trying to turn his life around, Tyler is worried about his younger brother Zeke and his friend Danny. Zeke and Danny have started carrying knives and Tyler is desperate to ensure that they don't make the same mistakes that he's made in the past. The play follows them over the course of one day as the tensions are mounting and Tyler must intervene to avoid a tragedy and try to talk them all into breaking the chain."
